KEY FEEDBACK

- > UCAS thanked for their support to students, advisers and providers over the last twelve months.
- Moving the Equal Consideration Date (ECD) seen as a positive change by providers and advisers this year, however, not all advisers thought the date should be permanently changed.
- > Group members raised concerns with Myriad.
- > The new enhancements for Clearing Plus were welcomed.
- Advisers noted that a mixture of virtual and physical events should be the norm in the future. Students preferred physical open days as it helped them look at courses in details and make decisions between universities.
- > There were mixed views from students on whether applicants should apply with predicted grades or actual grades, as although applying with actual grades appeared a good option it could also hamper an applicant's hope if their predictions were low.
